

ADJOURNED MEETING CITY COUNCIL
April 18, 2012

The City Council of the City of Albemarle met in an adjourned session on Wednesday, April 18, 2012, at 6:30 p.m. at the Rosebriar Restaurant. Mayor Elbert L. "Whit" Whitley presided and the following Councilmembers were present, to wit: Troy E. Alexander, Martha Sue Hall, Judy Holcomb, Ronnie Michael, Jack F. Neel, Dexter Townsend and T. Ed Underwood. Absent, none.

The City Council held a meeting with the members of the Planning and Zoning Board and the Zoning Board of Adjustment to discuss matters of common interest.

Mayor Whitley called the meeting to order.

Mayor Whitley stated that the annual spring cookout and picnic for the City will be Wednesday, May 16 from 11:00 am until 1:00 pm and all City boards and commissions are invited to attend. The Mayor asked if anyone had any comments they would like to share.

Upon questioning concerning Bird Road, Planner I Carolyn Martin stated that a gentleman came into the office wanting to use the building beside the car wash on Bird Road for storage.

Councilmember Alexander mentioned a police matter that was recently in the Stanly News and Press and Mayor Whitley stated that this is being handled by Police Chief Halliburton and the City Manager.

Councilmember Hall asked Ms. Martin about the status of the burned property on 2nd Street. Ms. Martin stated that she is not aware of anything being done at this time and the vegetation growth is her concern.

Councilmember Michael stated that Planning and Community Development Director Keith Wolf had turned this property over to James Luster with Centralina Council of Governments.
