Home Safety Tips

- 1. Make sure your address is visible on the house or mailbox, so emergency workers can locate your house quickly.
- 2. Report any suspicious activity in or around your neighborhood.
- 3. Don't let anyone in your home without proper identification.
- 4. Many burglars will spend no more than 60 seconds attempting to break into a home. Make sure every external door has sturdy, well-installed deadbolt locks.
- 5. Sliding glass doors offer easy access if not properly secured. You can secure them by installing commercially available locks or putting a broomstick or wooden dowel in the inside track to jam the door.
- 6. Avoid hiding a key under a door mat, rock or flower pot near your door. If you must hide an outside key, be creative. A relative or trusted neighbor would be the preferred choice to maintain an extra key.
- 7. When you move to a new house or apartment, have a competent locksmith rekey the locks.
- 8. All outside doors to your home should be metal or solid wood.
- 9. Install a peephole in all entry doors so you can see who is outside without opening the door.
- 10. Don't use door chains; they break easily and don't keep intruders out.
- 11. Prune back shrubbery and trees so that they don't obscure windows or doors.
- 12. Install outdoor floodlights or motion-sensor lights to eliminate any areas where someone might hide especially around entrance and garage doors.
- 13. When you go out of town, give your house that "lived-in look" by putting a few of your lights on timers. Also, stop your mail and newspaper delivery or have a trusted neighbor pick it up for you.
- 14. Record the serial numbers of all of your valuables. This allows us to return your property if recovered after a larceny.
